# Pastor's Corner

Greetings,

I was in my first winter as a Pastor of two small churches in Wykoff and Fountain Minnesota. Kelly and John and I lived in the Church parsonage at the Wykoff Church. It was a normal week of winter ministry—evening bible

studies, meetings, and a weekend youth activity, along with Sunday worship and sermon prep. Right in the early part of the week, I noticed the church bathrooms needed cleaning. We were a small enough church and did not have funds for a custodial staff, so we all volunteered. That same afternoon, the morning snowfall ended, and I realized the sidewalks would need to be shoveled before an evening event at the church. As I found myself in the middle of clearing the snow off the church sidewalks, I asked God why I am here. I went directly from cleaning toilets to clearing snow. God told me I was here to help change lives.

I am sure we can identify with the emotion and question to God of why I am here—what is my purpose in life. I remember one evening, as Kelly and John and I gathered at the dinner table for our family meal together, I asked Kelly what her day was like. She told me, exhaustedly, she was the baseball pitcher for a three-year-old most of the day (our Son John.) I believe we all look up to God from time to time and ask God, “What is my purpose in life?” Yet, if we look to God’s Word from the very beginning, we realize very clearly, even on the rough days, weeks, and months, we each have been created in God’s image for a very important and defined purpose. *“Then God said, “Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth.” (Genesis 1:26)*

Yes, even on the days we feel used and abused, we are a purpose of God, and we are here for a reason. I remember heading into Subway one day, feeling alone. I thought I would buy a sub and bring it back to my desk to eat lunch alone. I got into Subway and noticed a community leader eating lunch who called me over to eat lunch with him, and we

began to set up a summer ministry over that lunch that took off in the summer. We are not alone; we are the purpose of God.

*“And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit.” (II Corinthians 3:18)*

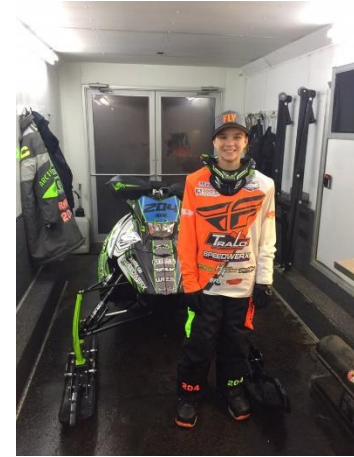

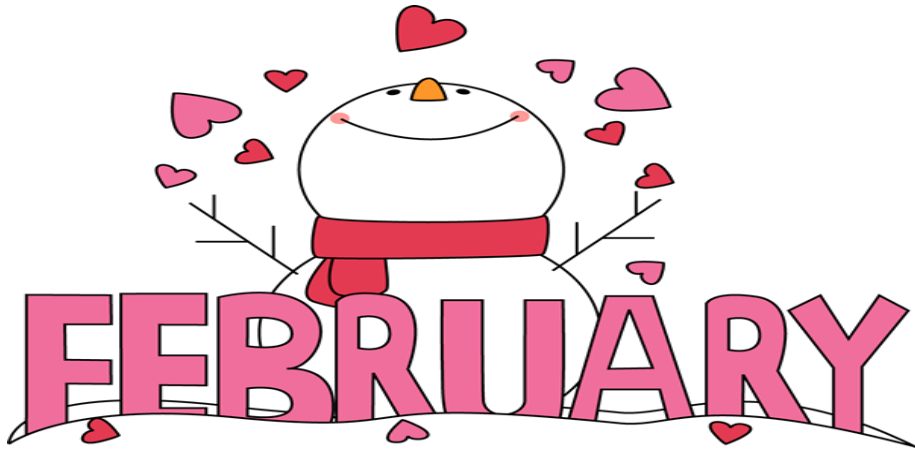
